The school has 2281 students (1111 Boys and 1170 Girls) and 210 staff members on its roll & gives equal importance to the academic and co-curricular activities.

3. ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE & ACHIEVEMENTS

The Class XII (SSCE) and Class X (SSE) results of the Academic Year 2022-'23 really proved that Excellence is the gradual result of constant striving.

Class XII

In the SSCE exam, out of the 134 students appeared, 120 passed out with distinction. 23 students got all A1 and 7 students scored centum in different subjects.

Abhiya Johnson is the School Topper and Topper in Commerce stream, scoring 98.6%, Elita Ann Binu is the Science stream Topper, scoring 97.2% and Ann Sithara Jimmy and Angel Mariya Antony are Humanities stream Toppers scoring 96.8%.

Class X

In the SSE exams, out of the 185 students appeared, 149 passed out with distinction. Diya Noby is the school topper with 98.2%.10 students scored full 100 in different subjects. 17 students got all A1.

- In the survey of Education World India School Ranking, our school is ranked SECOND in Kochi and FOURTH in Kerala.
