Dear Parents,

Childhood is an ideal time for language acquisition, with children naturally absorbing language with ease. At our kindergarten, we value the learning of the mother tongue while prioritizing the development of English communication skills. We strive to create a supportive language environment throughout the day and are thrilled to see our little ones expanding their use of English words.

Your involvement can greatly help children develop strong communication skills. Regularly engage in conversations using simple words—even saying just one word is fine if that's all they can manage for the moment. Incorporate English into daily routines by using simple phrases during everyday activities. For example, while dressing, you can say, "Let's put on your blue socks."

Make speaking activities fun. For instance, tell your child that a toy only understands English. Have a conversation with the toy yourself to encourage your child to do the same. Explore books together and point to pictures as you say the words. Encourage your child to read familiar words on billboards, newspapers, and magazines. While screen time should be controlled, watching educational cartoons and singing action songs can help make learning new words fun and memorable.

Finally, remember to save 'mistakes' for later. Don't stop your child when they're speaking. If you stop to correct, it can be hard for them to build spoken fluency and may hurt their confidence. Instead, gently model the correct usage. Praise their efforts to keep them motivated and confident.
